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South Carolina's Employment Situation November 2011

Unemployment rate plummets; Employment climbs

The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell to 9.9 percent in November, an unprecedented 0.6 percent drop from last month's 10.5 percent rate. This represents the largest monthly drop since 1976, the first year the Bureau of Labor Statistics made the monthly data series available. The national unemployment rate also saw a significant decrease, from 9 percent in October to 8.6 percent in November.

The labor force was reduced by 4,750 from October to November; the number of those employed grew by 9,777, and the number of unemployed declined by 14,527. The labor force level was 2,164,970 in November. These figures indicate that some jobseekers have suspended job search activities.

Nonfarm payroll employment grew 15,000 from October to November, and is up significantly (+30,700) from a year ago. This over-the-year job growth is similar to trends experienced prior to the most recent recession and is the largest increase for this time period since 2006.

Manufacturing employment increased by 900 from October to November and showed a very healthy gain of 10,800 since last year. The industry with the largest month-to-month increase was Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+8,800), with 7,100 of that increase from Retail Trade. Professional and Business Services (+6,600) had the second largest increase. The expected seasonal decline in Leisure and Hospitality continued with a drop of 3,300 in the last month.

The Conference Board's Help Wanted Online Index, a global, independent business membership and research association working in the public interest, showed that the number of online ads in South Carolina decreased by 2,100 (to 45,400 ads) from October to November. However, this number is 2,500 more than a year ago. Occupations with the largest number of ads included registered nurses, occupational therapists and truck drivers. Nationally, there was a decline of 76,200 ads posted in November.

"Through the efforts of the businesses in our state who have hired more South Carolinians, we have seen a significant decrease in the unemployment rate," said SC Department of Employment and Workforce Executive Director Abraham Turner. "We want to partner with employers to help train the state's workforce because we know that training is the most important component in providing businesses with a skilled and productive labor force. Through a partnership of this kind, I am optimistic that job growth will continue in the coming months."
