## Retail Sales

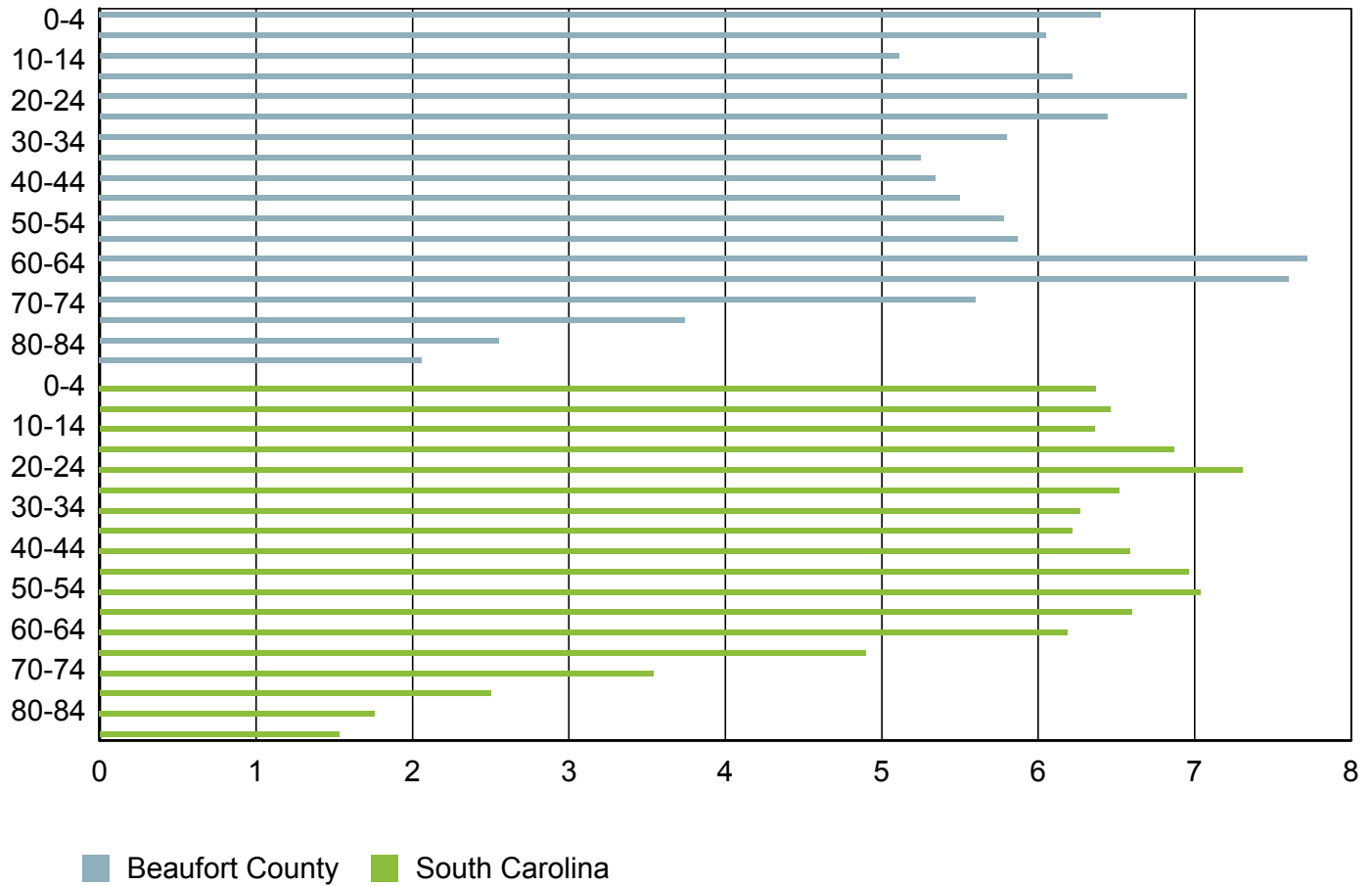

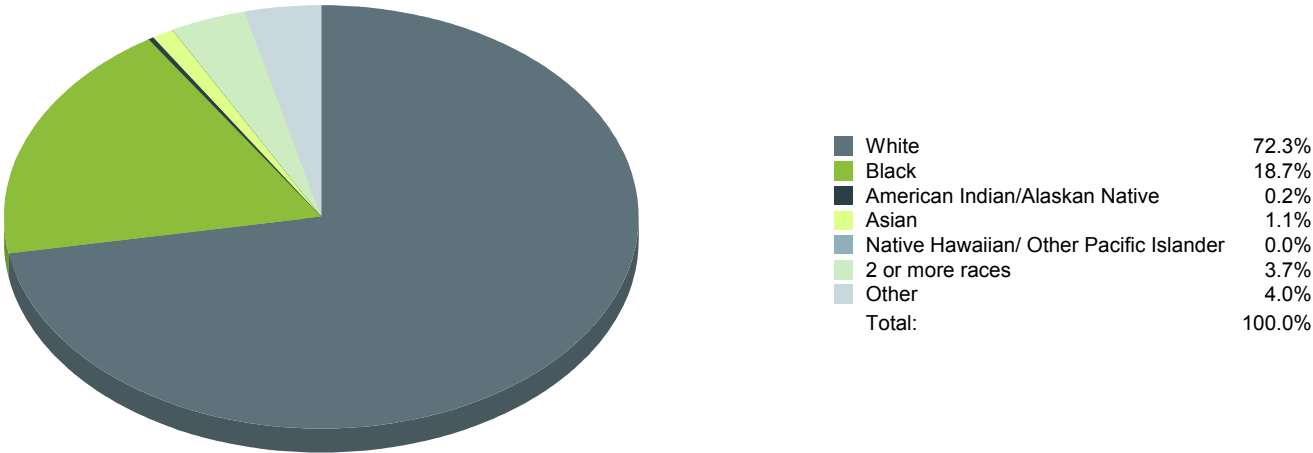

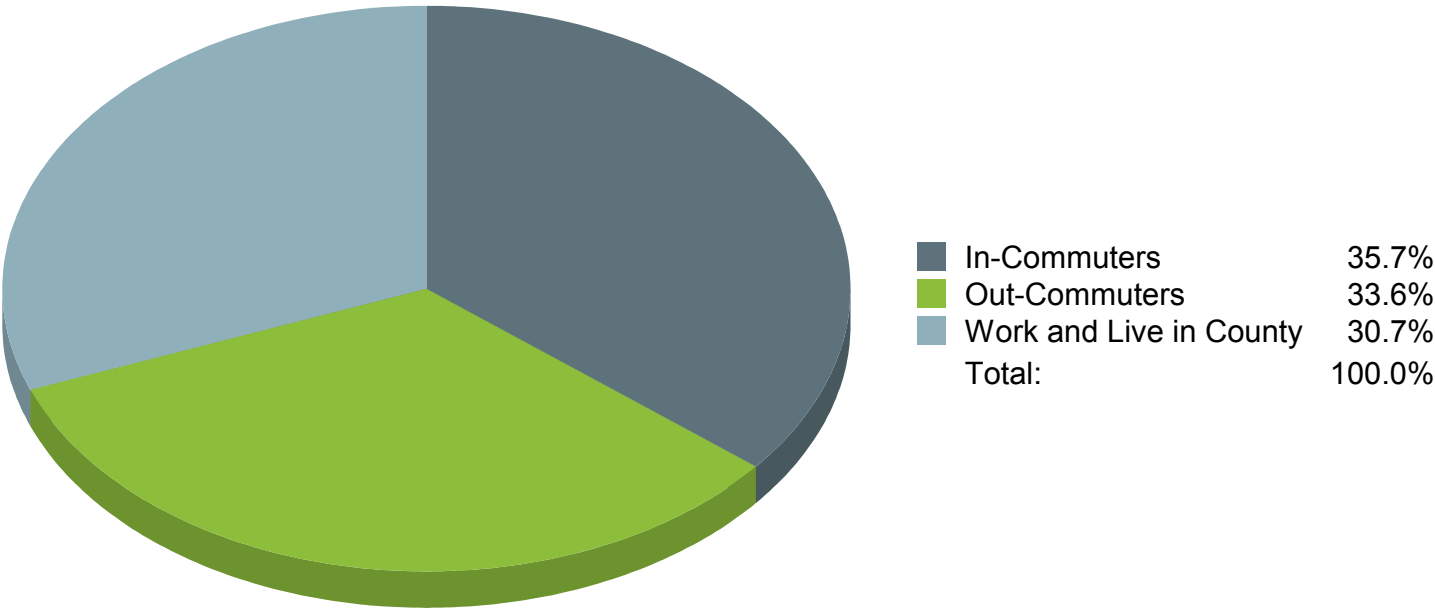

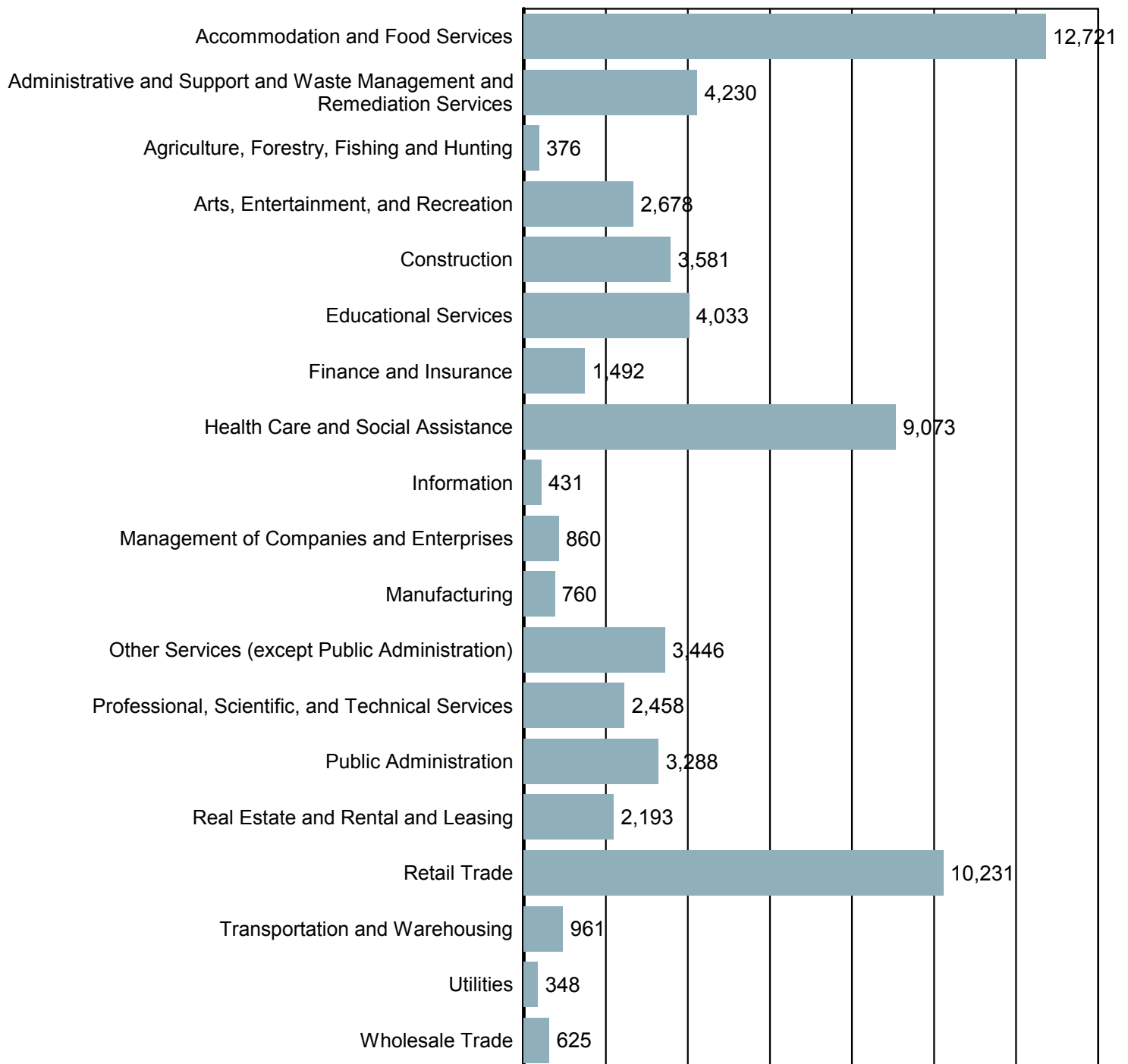

## Employment by Industry

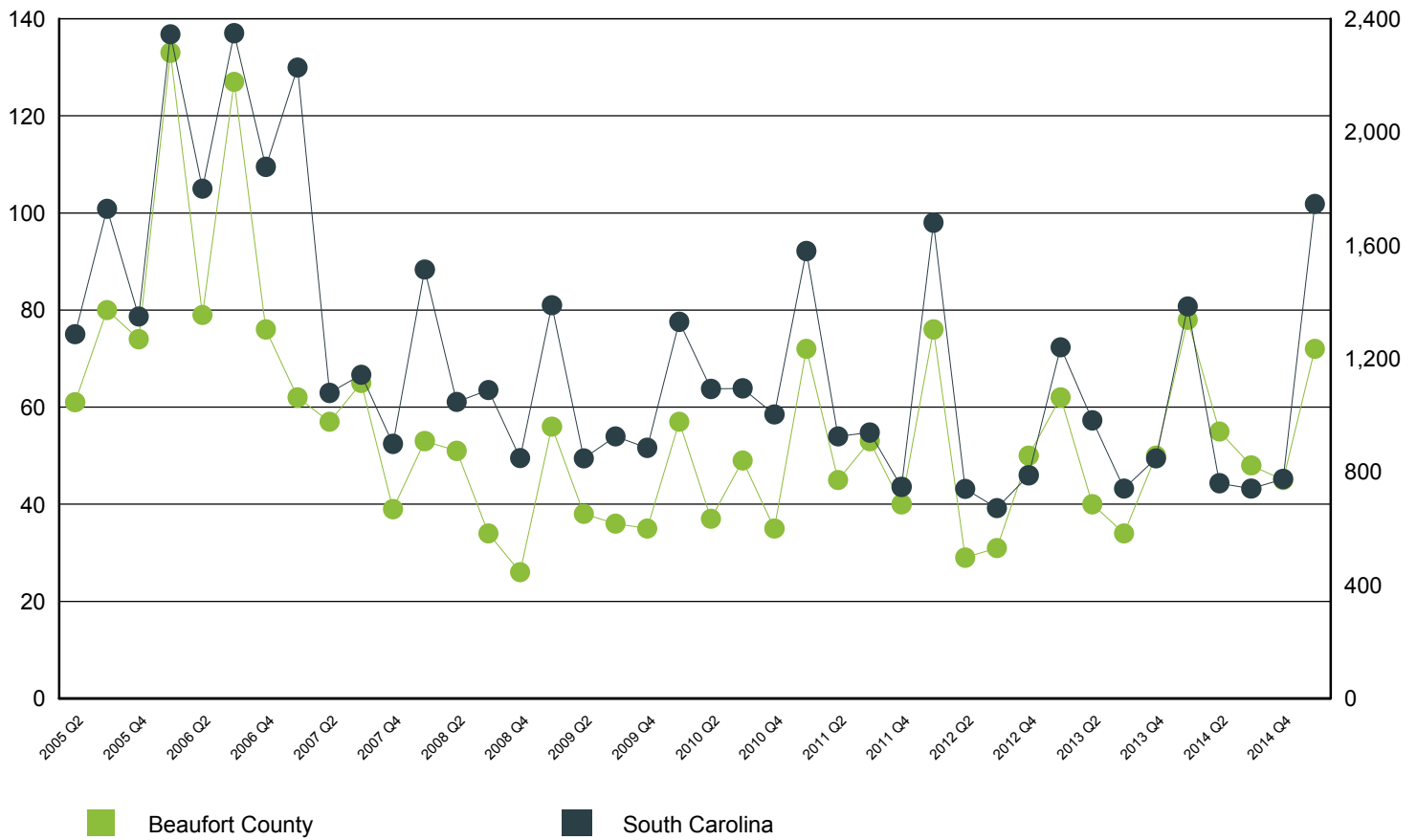

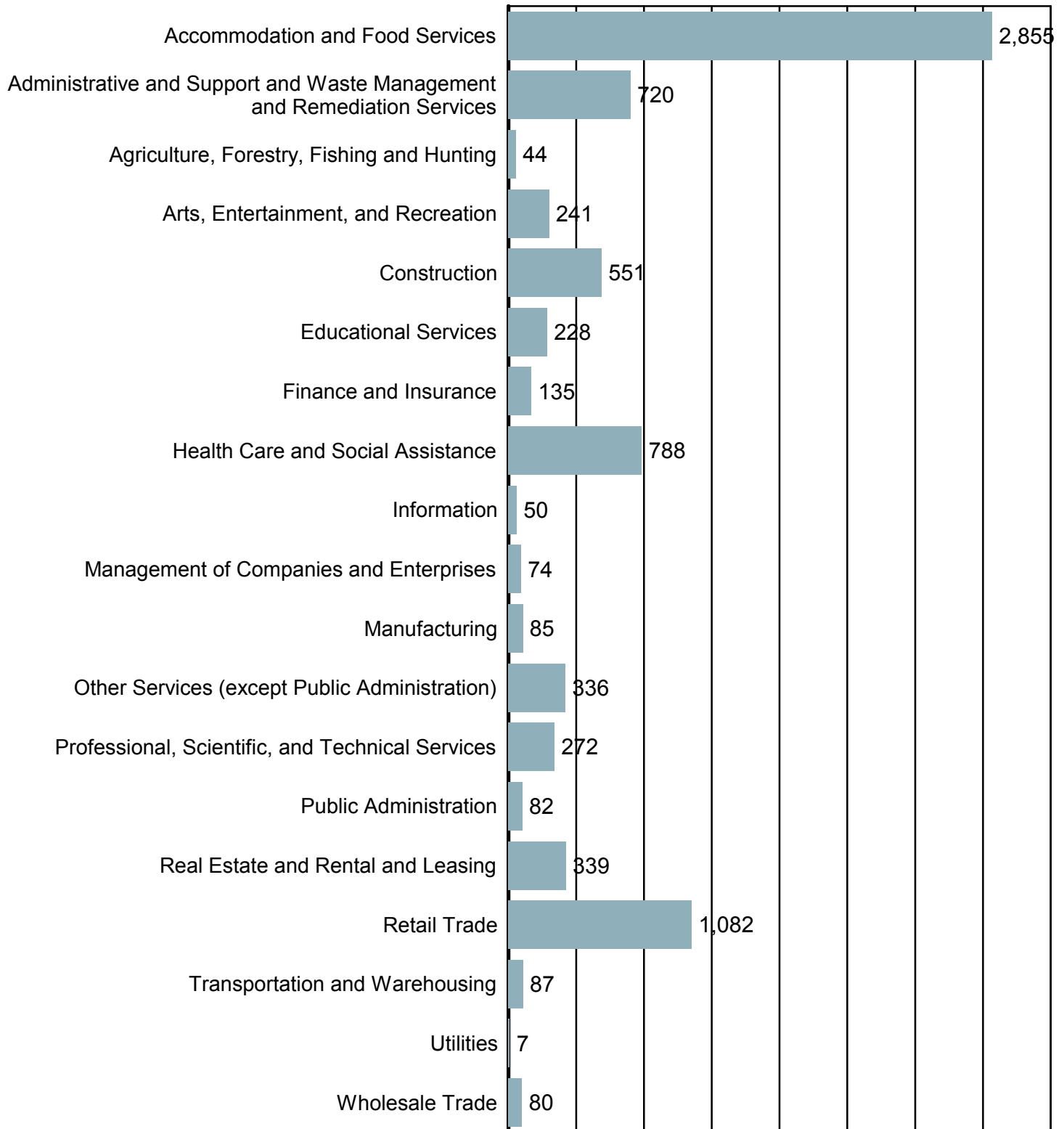

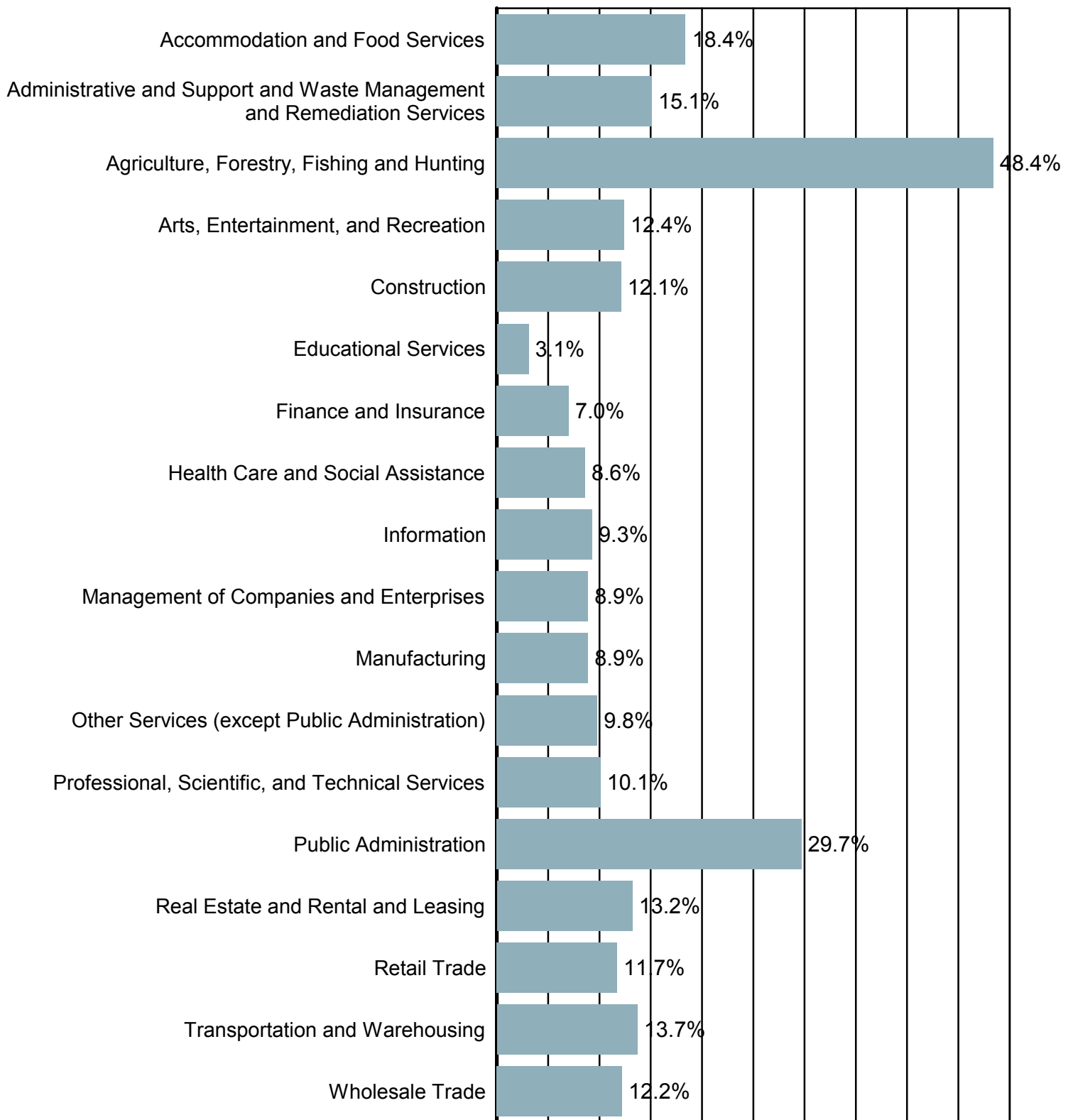

## New Hires by Industry



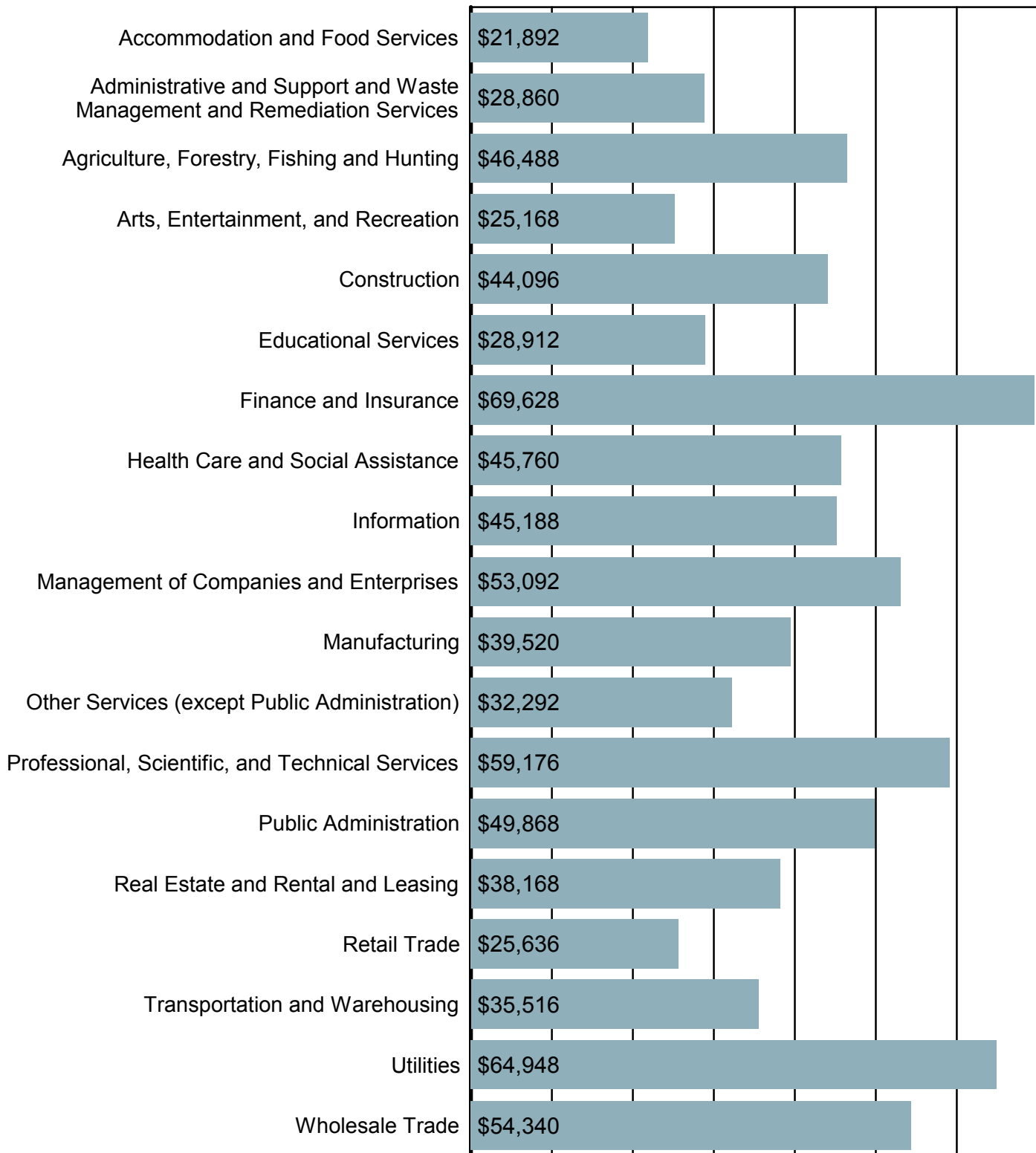

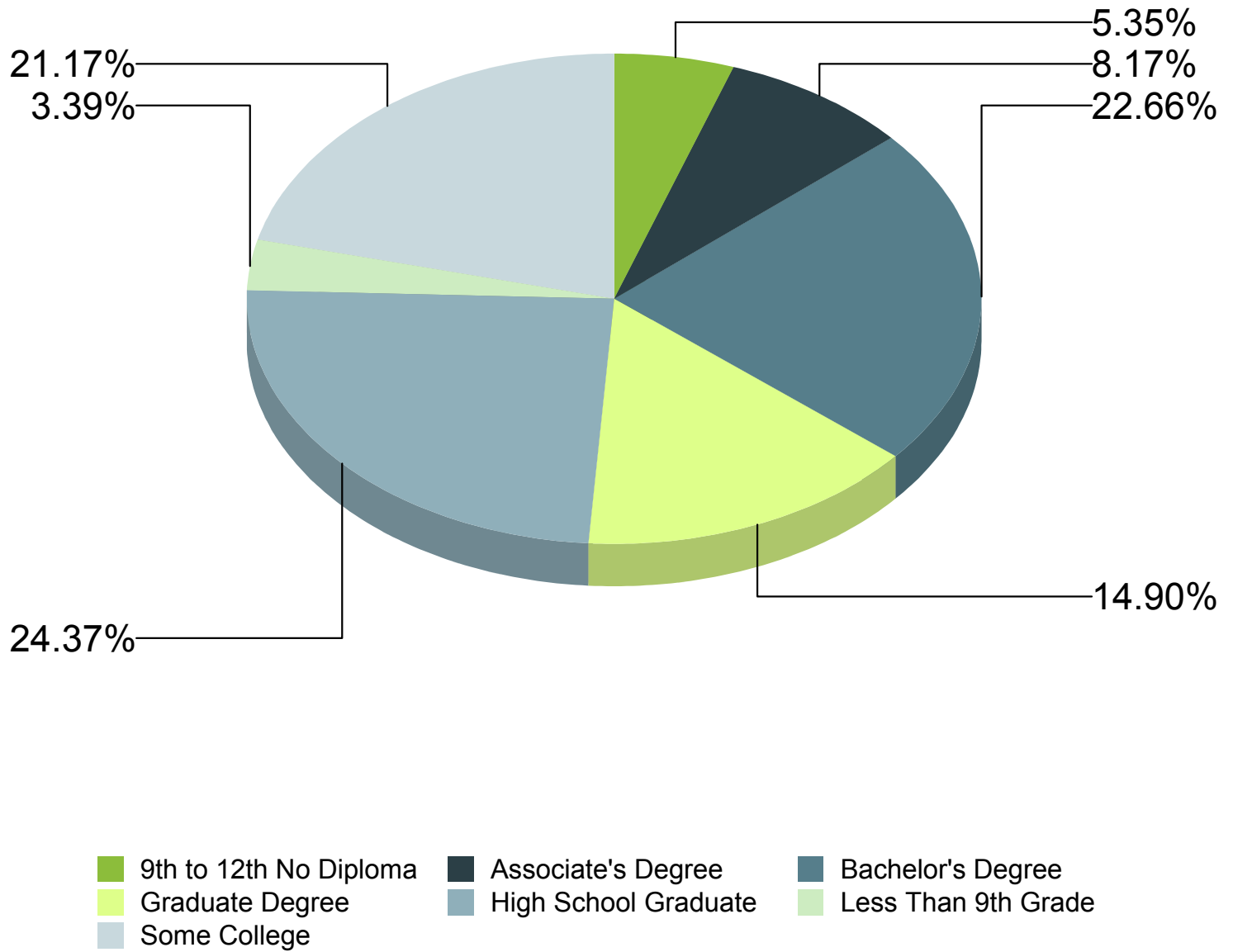

## Educational Attainment

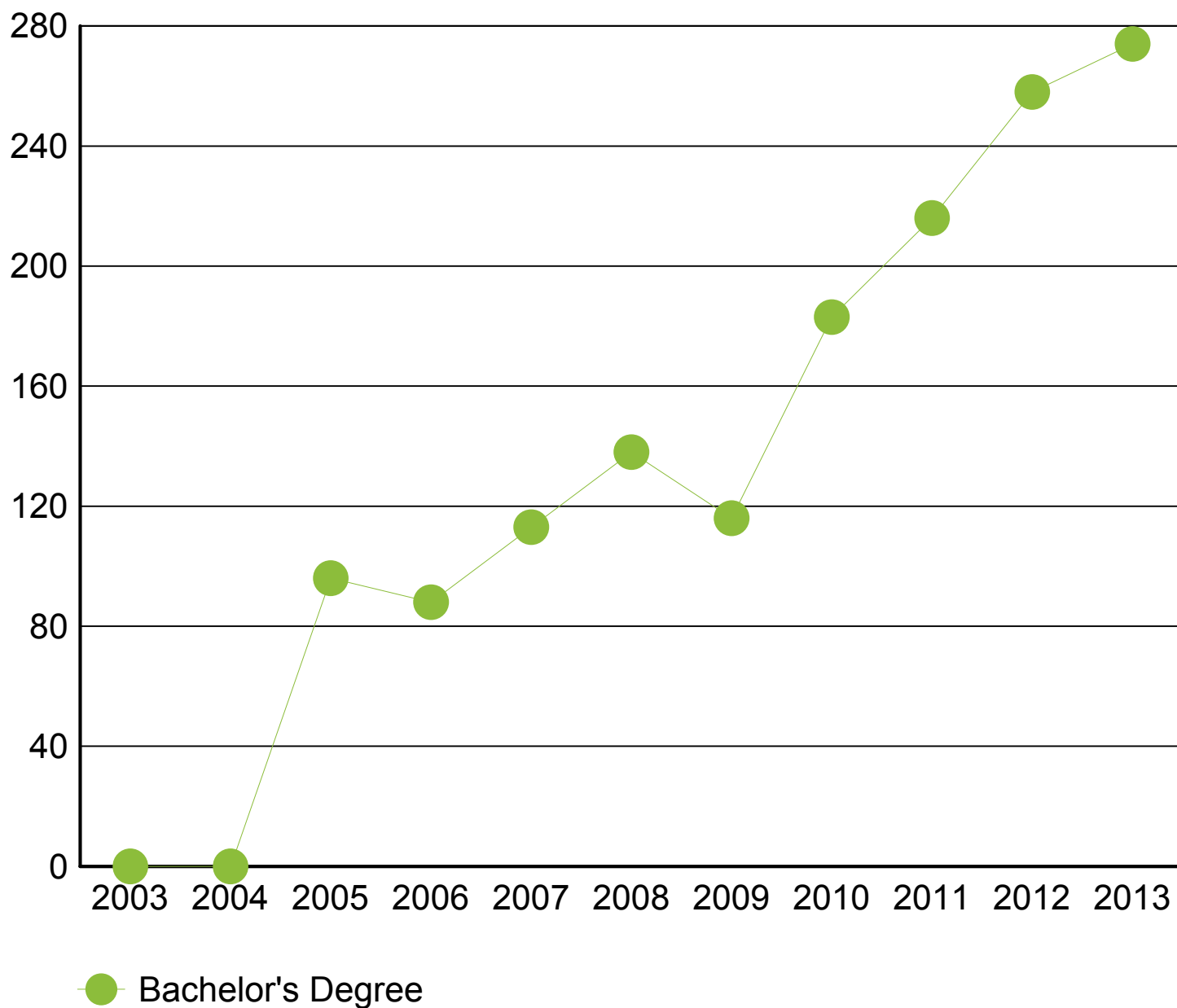
(Population 25 Years and Older)
